


Resource Sheet: Bookmark

This is an example bookmark that could be used to support generalization when reading. This bookmark will act as a reminder to the adult for how to best help the child. The child could draw a picture that would help to remind them to use good sound/s, e.g., a snake if their target is /s/. The child can monitor how many good sounds they have remembered by pointing to a star on the bookmark each time they say their sound, and seeing if they can get to 10.

<p>Name: _____</p> <p>My target: To remember to use my _____ sound/s</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">★ Before I start reading, remind me that I need to remember to use my _____ sound/s.★ Encourage me to describe the pictures, as this will make it harder to remember my sound/s!★ Ask me questions about what I've read, e.g., <i>who was in the story/ have I been to a place like that before/ what was my favourite thing about the story.</i> When I answer you, listen out to check I'm using my good sounds.★ If I forget my sound, give me a gentle reminder, e.g., "I didn't hear your good sound when you said that word" .and sometimes I'll try the word again,★ Most importantly, when I remember to use my sound/s give me lots of praise so I know what I've done well! We can use the stars to count up how many good sounds I remember on each page. <div style="text-align: center;"></div>
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
